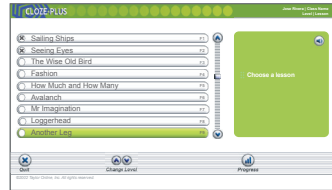


## Lesson Sequence at a Glance

Each lesson is comprised of four to sixteen paragraphs on a given social studies or science topic and designed for students whose assigned vocabulary study level (AVL) is 1.0-6.0, as determined by RPA™. All lessons use graded vocabulary. There are 20 lessons per level.

### Lesson Selection

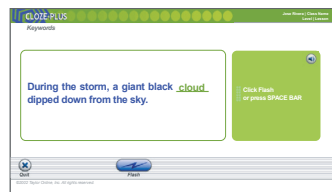
Students select a lesson. Lessons should be completed in the order presented. Completed lessons are marked with an X.

### Type and Flash

At Levels A and B, each keyword flashes three times, then disappears. The student is directed to type the word and is given only one chance to do so correctly. The word is then displayed and pronounced.

### Meaning Completion

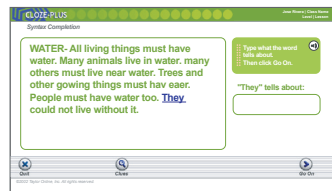
Three types of activities follow. In meaning completion, the student is instructed to select one of four choices to complete the meaning of a paragraph. If the student is unsure, s/he may click the Clues button which will highlight key contextual information. If the first choice is wrong, it is eliminated, and the student is asked to choose from the remaining three. If the second attempt is wrong, all choices except the correct one are eliminated.

### Syntax Completion

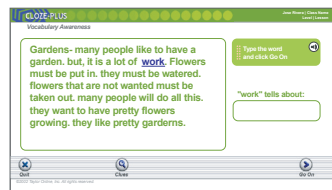
In syntax completion, the student is presented with a short paragraph which contains a blank in one of the sentences. The student is instructed to type in a word of his own choosing which will complete the meaning of the sentence. If the student is correct, a congratulatory message appears. Other possible word choices are also displayed for the student.

### Vocabulary Awareness

In vocabulary awareness, the student reads a short paragraph in which a target word is highlighted and underlined. The student is instructed to type the word that refers to the target word or choose an appropriate meaning or use from choices. There is only one correct answer.

### Progress Report

At the end of each lesson a summary of that lesson is displayed, along with summaries of the previous nine lessons. The report displays the lesson number and the student comprehension scores. Only multiple choice activity responses are counted towards the student's comprehension score. The program tracks students word analysis skills and these skills can be reviewed by a teacher within Reading Plus® management.

If a student chooses to Quit before a lesson is completed, he or she will be returned to the portion of the lesson that they left off the next time they select the program.
